Our commitments

We are committed to supporting you in your role. We will:

- Respect your rights and dignity, treat you fairly, regardless of age, gender, ethnic origin, religion, sexual orientation or ability
- Take all reasonable steps to make sure you are matched to a volunteer role most suited to you
- Provide you with access to an induction, training and development opportunities.
- Communicate key developments and changes that relate to your volunteering promptly and clearly, usually by email
- Link you to a named supervisor who will meet with you regularly
- Ask how your volunteering may be improved
- Be honest with you about any ways that you may develop and deal with any issues promptly
- Offer you access to reasonable out of pocket travel expenses for agreed journeys
- Recognise your contribution and involve you in developing our work together.

Volunteer conduct

We ask all volunteers to respect this code of conduct to ensure CPRE is a positive and safe environment for everyone. We ask you to:

- Be a positive role model
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of everyone, including other volunteers, supporters and employees
- Treat everyone equally and not discriminate on the basis of age, gender, ethnic origin, religion, sexual orientation or ability.

We ask you to:

- Accept volunteering duties with an open mind and willingness to learn
- Ensure high standards in language, manner, punctuality, preparation and presentation
- Refrain from verbal, physical and emotional abuse of others
- Share any changes in circumstances that may affect your suitability availability to volunteer, giving as much notice as possible if unable to volunteer
- Raise any concerns as soon as possible
- Avoid being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs while actively volunteering
- Report any behaviour or activity that causes concern
- Wear appropriate clothing, including uniform or Personal Protective Equipment
- Maintain a professional and courteous manner in all communications with volunteers, members, employees, partners and the public, verbally, in writing and online, including via social media
- Participate in any training or briefing opportunities relevant to your role and keep your skills and knowledge up-to-date
- Be dependable, recognising the commitment and responsibility undertaken
- Volunteer within safe working practices and adhere to policies and guidelines including health and safety, safeguarding, security, data protection and others relevant to the role
- Respect the confidentiality of CPRE and the details of members, guests or other volunteers in accordance with Data Protection Policy and GDPR.
