

The Richard Lloyd Countryside Champion Award

Award Guidance for Nominations

1. About the Award

The Richard Lloyd Countryside Champion Award celebrates an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to protecting, enhancing or championing Gloucestershire's countryside.

Created in memory of our Vice Chair, Richard Lloyd MBE, this award honours someone who shares Richard's deep passion for the environment and his lifelong commitment to safeguarding Gloucestershire's countryside for future generations.

This award complements CPRE Gloucestershire's existing project-based awards scheme by recognising an individual rather than a project or initiative.

2. Who Can Be Nominated?

- Individuals may be involved in projects entered into the CPRE Gloucestershire Awards scheme; however, to avoid duplication, please do not submit a nomination for this award if the individual is part of a project being nominated for the project-based awards in the same year.
- Nominees must be individuals rather than organisations, groups or businesses.
- Nominees should live in Gloucestershire or have lived in Gloucestershire or made a significant contribution within the county.
- Nominations should highlight a meaningful contribution to protecting, enhancing or promoting Gloucestershire's countryside and environment.
- CPRE Gloucestershire trustees, staff and members of the judging panel are not eligible to receive the award.

3. Making a Nomination

- Nominations must be submitted using the official online nomination form.
- Nominations must be received by 9:00am on Monday 14 September 2026.
- Please provide as much relevant information in the online form as possible to support your nomination.
- CPRE Gloucestershire reserves the right to exclude nominations that are incomplete, inappropriate or submitted after the closing date.

4. Judging

- All eligible nominations will be considered by a judging panel appointed by CPRE Gloucestershire.
- The panel will look at the nominee's contribution, impact and commitment to Gloucestershire's countryside and environment.
- The judges' decision is final.

5. The Award

- The winner will receive a £250 cash prize and a framed certificate.
- The award will be presented at CPRE Gloucestershire's Awards Ceremony at Elmore Court in autumn 2026.
- If no nomination is considered suitable, CPRE Gloucestershire reserves the right not to make an award.
- If the winner is unable to attend the ceremony, alternative arrangements may be made.

6. Publicity

- By submitting a nomination, you agree that the information provided may be used by CPRE Gloucestershire to administer and promote the award.
- The winner may be featured on CPRE Gloucestershire's website, social media channels, press releases and other promotional materials.
